# Double glazed windows and replacement of window joinery

Your committee has agreed to prioritise this project and to apply for grant funding for the full cost. At this stage we will only proceed if the applications are successful. The Works Committee's assessment is that the aluminium window joinery is 50 years old, deteriorating and heat is being lost through the sealing. Double glazed windows will have a significant effect on heating loads in the back room in particular. It was considered that this project will add value and future proof our building.

We will be insulating the higher interior wall between the playing room and office/ kitchen.

We intend continuing on with our LED lighting replacement programme of one strip/line every year.

It is Bill's view that the timeline for replacing the card dealing machine should be about 5 years.

And the committee has agreed that the carpet is still in reasonable condition (it has responded well to spot cleaning, thanks to Ashley M).

Our ten year asset replacement plan indicates that new curtains and a heat pump (saving electricity) for the back room will be our next priorities. However this plan is a guide only and it is not a confirmed work programme.

We acknowledge that there has been an intermittent problem with the printer and if this cannot be addressed, we will look to replacement.

#### Cleaning update.

Thank you for taking part in our recent simple survey. There were 113 responses and 89 of these were indications of satisfaction with the current cleaning arrangements. The committee has agreed to a further weekly toilet clean by our contractors, Busy Bees, as this was considered to be a fair compromise. Mary, our house keeper, will organise for extra cleaning to be done by our volunteers from time to time.

#### A snippet from the Wanaka Bridge Club newsletter - An over - aggressive double?

A piece of advice is "if your penalty doubles work, you are not doubling enough." This may sound counter intuitive – but if you double only when you are guaranteed to defeat the contract you will miss out on many cases when you are likely to defeat the contract but fail to do so. If 10 % of your missed doubles fail, your rewards on the 90% which succeed will more than offset your losses.
